Development Proposal No 506

Proposal to Establish a New Catholic 11-19 Co-Educational Post-Primary School in West Belfast

Notice is hereby given that a proposal, under Article 14 of the Education and Libraries (NI) Order 1986, has been submitted to the Education Authority by the Council for Catholic Maintained Schools on behalf of Trustees of Christian Brothers' School, the Trustees of the Parish of St Paul (Corpus Christi College) and the Trustees of St Rose's Dominican College to the effect that:

A new Catholic 11-19 co-educational post-primary school with an enrolment number of 1000 and admission number of 150 to Year 8 (being in effect an amalgamation of Christian Brothers' School, Corpus Christi College and St Rose's Dominican College), be established with effect from 1 September 2018, or as soon as possible thereafter.

This proposal is linked to and predicated upon Department of Education approval for:
the proposed discontinuance of Christian Brothers' School – Development Proposal No 503;
the proposed discontinuance of Corpus Christi College – Development Proposal No 504;
the proposed discontinuance of St Rose's Dominican College – Development Proposal No 505; and
the proposed reduction in admission and enrolment numbers of St Louise's College and the proposal to become co-educational – Development Proposal No 507.
